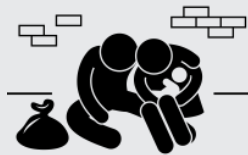

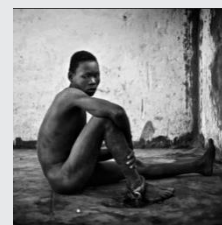

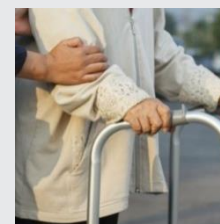

Number 3 NCDs - We are products of our lifestyle and environment

“The four NCDs, principally cardiovascular disease, cancer, diabetes and chronic respiratory disease –are responsible for 65% of all deaths in UAE and the probability of dying prematurely (between ages 30 and 70 years) from the 4 main NCD’s is 19%. It is also important to note the alarming increase in the incidences of obesity, hypertension, and diabetes mellitus among our population. “

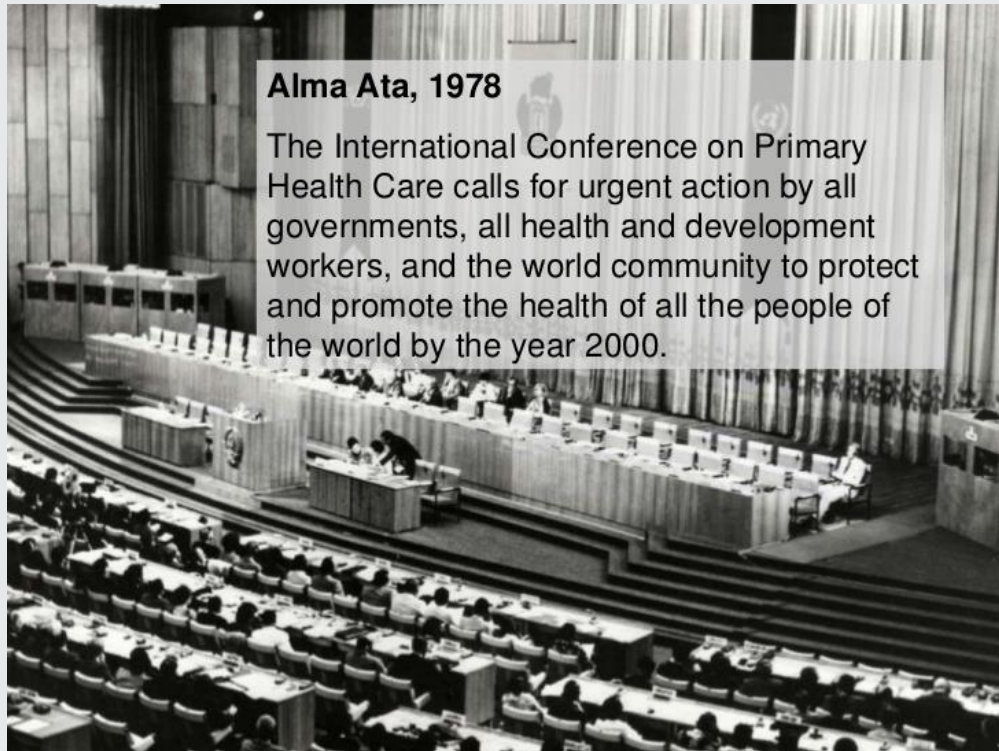

Number 2: Primary Health Care



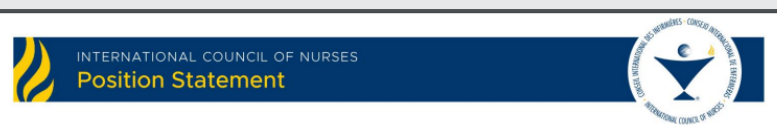
